Program Details

The Leave No Trace Trainer course provides students an opportunity to develop a high level of understanding of the seven principles of Leave No Trace. Those who successfully complete the course will have the skills to provide LNT educational programming to their own student participants. This is an essential course for outdoor educators, guides and rangers.

The Leave No Trace Trainer Course will take place predominantly at Blanchard Mountain, a local mountain about 11 miles from the American Alpine Institute Headquarters (the Institute).

Classroom sessions will be conducted outdoors, so please be prepared for all kinds of weather. The Cascades are a wet mountain range and Bellingham can be similar during the spring and fall. It is important to understand that inclement weather can be a hindrance to the learning environment. Proper clothing and food can go a long way to help sustain comfort while learning in the backcountry.

Each day will run from approximately 8am to approximately 5:30pm. Please bring enough food and water for a full day of outdoor learning and activities.
